In 2023, Tiny Miracles reached **more families** than at any previous point in our nearly 20 year history.

In-person mentoring at all 6 partner hospitals was complemented by virtual mentoring where necessary. Monthly "After The NICU" education sessions, connection meetings and social gatherings provided ongoing support to families.

Maternal & Infant Mental Health Panel

On Wednesday, March 29, Tiny Miracles hosted its first ever Maternal & Infant Mental Health Panel for volunteers and professionals from the community. The free event included dinner and provided nursing continuing education credits.

Maternal mental health, and by default infants' mental health, has been at the center of Tiny Miracles' mission since its inception. Our peer parent mentors, who have each experienced the preterm birth of their child and subsequent NICU stay, provide invaluable support to NICU families. Peer parent mentors share their experiences and often help decrease the feelings of worry, guilt, sadness, isolation, confusion, and anger for families beginning their NICU journey.

The event was funded by a grant from Union Savings Bank Foundation.


Racing to Help Tiny Miracles

Throughout my time at the NICU, I was fortunate enough to come across a beautiful foundation called Tiny Miracles. They provided me emotional support at a much needed time, and they were able to provide transportation for me to see my daughter daily. I am grateful for everything this foundation has done for my family and me."

A New Office thanks to The Darien Foundation

One of the biggest highlights of 2023 was a \$100,000 grant from The Darien Foundation to build out new headquarters space to consolidate all Tiny Miracles operations. Previously, Tiny Miracles held office space in Darien, but it could not accommodate the programming and support that we provide annually throughout Southwest Connecticut.

The new, central location will provide greater efficiency within the organization as well as visibility of our mission, and additional volunteer and programming opportunities to support its growing reach.

Tiny Miracles moved into the new space in December and immediately started using the space to host family programs, mentor education sessions and volunteer gatherings to assemble Tiny Treasures bags, care packages and blankets for NICU families.
